June 2002 -Agra

In the Sri Krishna Aided Higher Secondary School at Kumbakonam in the Thanjavur District of Tamil Nadu 94 children were dead and many injured. Erwadi fire incident was another worst fire incident in Tamil Nadu.

A major fire broke out at a multistorey market complex in Kolkata in which at least 19 people were killed and over a dozen critically injured.

2019 Surat fire

A fire occurred at a commercial complex in <u>Sarthana</u> jagatnaka area of <u>Surat</u> in the <u>Gujarat</u> state of India. Twenty-two students died and others were injured in an academic coaching centre located on the building's terrace. The fire was started by a short circuit on the ground floor; the students in the coaching centre were trapped by the destruction of a wooden staircase.
